It has been a busy month on the **Ellen Gibbs Matson Pickleball Courts** at Lakeside. Our **1st ANNUAL BATTLE of the PADDLES TOURNAMENT** at LCC on July 27th was a great success. Many thanks to Marianne Maher, Nancy Feinstein, Phil Olin, and Susan Barry for putting together a day of fun, competitive matches based on our LCC Ryder Cup format of Red and Blue teams. Thanks to the 24 players who participated! Forty round robin matches were played over the course of the day, including 4 play-off matches. Each player played 6 (of 9) matches in either the first or second “session” with each win being worth 1 point for the Red or Blue Team. The two players with the most points from each team in each session played in a play-off session (best 2 out of 3 games to 11). A win in the play-off matches was worth 4 points to the winning team. We had many ties between players, and had to break ties for the play-off participants by tallying the points scored against them during earlier matches. The final 8 players in the play-off sessions were: Rick Carr and Rosemary Cahill (Blue, winners) vs David Westcott and Carol Worth for Session 1; and Marianne Maher and Wayne Hand (Red, winners) vs Jim Clark and John Halstead (Blue) for Session 2. The Final Score for the day was Blue 27 and Red 17. Congrats to the winners and all of the participants for their great play and camaraderie. There were also ties among the individuals who scored the most points over the course of the day, with each scoring the maximum points possible. Ties were again broken in the same manner. The Individual Winners were: Rick Carr, Gold medal; Rosemary Cahill, Silver Medal; and Marianne Maher, Bronze Medal. Great job!


